

HOW TO GET INTO SERVICE

Contact the PI/CPC Coordinator or attend the monthly meeting.

We then help you to become familiar with the PI/CPC material.

You make a list of the locations you are to service. (*District 21 is all of Placer County*).

You then initiate a contact to get an OK to display/distribute A.A. material.

You get pamphlets and other material from the PI/CPC Alternate Coordinator.

You visit/check regularly to ensure that material is still on hand at the location.

You record what service you performed.

You attend a monthly PI/CPC District 21 committee meeting.

When you decide you cannot continue the service, you let the PI/CPC Coordinator know and help find your replacement..

What is PI/CPC

(PI) "Public Information in Alcoholics Anonymous means carrying the message of recovery to the still-suffering alcoholic by informing the general public about the A.A. program. We carry the message by getting in touch with the media, schools, industry, and other organizations which can report on the nature and purpose of A.A. and what it can do for alcoholics." (PI Workbook p.5)

(CPC) "Cooperating with nonalcoholic professionals is an effective way to carry the message to the sick alcoholic. Such people often meet the alcoholic in places where A.A. is not present. Through professionals, alcoholics may be reached who might otherwise never find the program, or they may be reached sooner with the help of informed non-A.As." (CPC Workbook p.6)
